REPORT OF MAY 2020 CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Church Council met by Zoom on the 13^{th} of May. Rev Rosalie Rayment-Hewitt led devotions, based on 1 Peter 2:1-10 – The Living Stone and a Chosen People.

Correspondence received included:

*numerous notifications from the Synod of VicTas and the Presbytery of North East Vic with advice and instructions re COVID-19, size of gatherings, use of buildings, as well as resources for worship and prayers from the Moderator and Chair of Presbytery.

*a request from Uniting Goulburn North East to enter into conversation regarding the use of the Fryers Street Meeting Room and 4 carparks by Uniting for approximately 2 years.

*information from the Pastoral Relations Committee of the Presbytery detailing a new initiative of the PRC which links each member of the PRC with a number of congregations 'to affirm the PRC's interest in the life of every congregation and the corresponding pastoral responsibility PRC is seeking to honour.' Rev Veronica Bradley is the nominated liaison person for the Shepparton and Shepparton Rural Congregations. Veronica is in placement in Wangaratta.

*notification from Sammy Stamp that the group has ceased to meet at 130 Lt Collins St and will 'regroup' at Trinity Uniting Church Brighton later in the year. In the meantime stamps are to be sent to Margaret and Ian Beaumont, 44A Seventh St, Parkdale 3195.

Decisions made include:

1) Church Council agreed to Uniting Goulburn North East occupying the Fryers Street meeting room for up to 2 years, commencing on the 1st of June 2020. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be drawn up to formalise the arrangement. The CC Secretary and Treasurer have been authorised to liaise with Uniting to set up the arrangement and to report to the CC. The fitting out of the meeting room and appropriate security will be the responsibility of Uniting.

2) Church Council, as the body responsible for decisions regarding worship, resolved that 'we hold off from celebrating Communion until we can all gather together again.'

3) While acknowledging that Rosalie's final service will be on the 7th of June, her placement with SUC concludes on the 31st of August. Rosalie will take Annual Leave and Long Service Leave between the 7th of June and the 31st of August. CC resolved that a Service of Release and farewell

will be held on Sunday, the 30th of August – arrangements will be dependent on the COVID-19 regulations in place at that time.

4) CC resolved to request the Presbytery to arrange a Mission Study with Shepparton and Shepparton Rural Congregations.

5) Lisa Tu'ungafasi, Shirley Marven and Ray Luscombe's terms of service on CC expired in May, but all agreed to continue to serve on CC until a meeting of the Congregation can be held to elect new Elders/Church Councillors.

6) The Op Shop Committee was requested to consider when and how the Op Shop might reopen and report to CC.

6) Church Council made the following *Minute of Commitment* in keeping with the Keeping Children Safe Policy.

The Shepparton Uniting Church is committed to providing safe places where people are cared for, nurtured and sustained. We have today adopted/reaffirmed the Keeping Children Safe Statement of Commitment as attached. Through it we recommit ourselves to the care, protection and safety of all people, particularly those who are vulnerable.

The Declaration will be displayed in the Narthex.

All members of the Congregation who hold a leadership role are required to sign an Individual Declaration – please see Jeni Fitzgerald for a copy of the form.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY continued Following the shipwreck, during which the centurion ensured that all on board were saved, the citizens of Malta entertained those on the ship. The church in Malta dates from this unlikely visit where God works through Paul. Many other churches, including the Methodists and Church of Scotland, came to Malta with waves of settlement.

Those preparing the reflections, 2019, noted: 'In such tempestuous journeys and chance encounters, God's will for his Church and all people comes to fulfilment. As Paul will proclaim in Rome, this salvation of God has been sent to all peoples (see Acts 28.28).

> *Reflection* This story is full of giving and receiving: Paul received unusual kindness from the islanders; Paul gives healing to the father of Publius and others; having lost everything in the storm, the 276 receive abundant provisions as they set sail. As Christians we are called to unusual kindness. But in order to give we must first learn to receive – from Christ and from others. More often than we realize, we are recipients of acts of kindness from people who are different from us. These acts also point towards the generosity and healing of our Lord. We who have been healed by the Lord are responsible for passing on that which we have received.

Prayer God, giver of life,

we thank you for the gift of your compassionate love which soothes and strengthens us.
We pray that our churches
may be always open to receive your gifts from one another.
Grant us a spirit of generosity to all
as we journey together in the path of Christian unity.

National Sorry Day is on the anniversary of the Bringing Then Home Report of the National Inquiry into the Separation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children, tabled May 26, 1997.
