### SERMON

We are only too aware of the importance of Christmas and Easter to our Faith and the life of the church. Let us not forget what a significant day Pentecost is. The day on which the first believers came alive in their faith, and the church was born. In some ways Pentecost is my favourite season as it reminds us of God's ongoing presence at work in the world and in our lives. There are millions of wonderful stories from around the world and throughout the ages of God working through people in powerful ways. Perhaps you might like to share a story of where you have seen God's Spirit at work and invite some-one else to share a story.

The disciples and their friends had been a small and vulnerable community but on the day of Pentecost they no longer felt either small or vulnerable. They were ready to take on the world.

In our celebration of Pentecost we celebrate that day when God poured out his Holy Spirit upon all people as he promised through the prophet Joel. We celebrate the gift of the Spirit and how it creates, upholds, and sustains the church as a whole. We celebrate How God has gifted us for the life we share together and the work and ministry we are called to do in Christ's name.

The Holy Spirit makes God's presence real to us bringing into our lives strength and support and teaching and comfort. The fruit of the Spirit at work in our lives is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5:22,23)

Through the Holy God also gives us gifts designed for the building up of the body of the church, and for the individual ministries to which we are called, and for our spiritual life together.

The prophet Joel, in his prophecy of the last days, mentions some of the gifts that have been given by God through his Spirit: gifts of vision and gifts of dreams; gifts of prophecy poured out upon our sons and daughters, upon our young and upon our old. Peter and the disciples on the day of Pentecost were enabled to share the story of Christ such that the Spirit of God enabled it to be heard by people in their own languages.

Paul - lists some of the gifts that God gives and explores with the Corinthian congregation how those gifts can be used and abused.

Spiritual gifts - range from the exotic and dramatic (speaking in tongues, working miracles) to the less dramatic of helping and administration.

This list of gifts begins with the gift of faith itself, the confession that Jesus is Lord. It includes but is not limited to gifts of teaching; discernment; encouragement; hospitality; praying for others; the gift of the word of wisdom; prophecy; administration; helping; healing; and the gift of mercy.

Gifts that are given by the spirit that go beyond our natural talents and abilities.

None of us will have all those gifts. But all of us will have gifts that God wants us to use for the benefit of the church and its ministry as we are enabled to do so by the Holy Spirit, the presence of God within us.

So What gifts do you have?

What gift or set of gifts has God poured out upon you so that you might love and serve your God and your neighbour in the way God has intended especially for you ?

- try to identify within yourself what God has given to you - to use in God's work.

Prayer and reflection on this passage from Corinthians.

Whatever the gift it is not just for our own sake but to be used in the work of God, the ongoing work of Christ, a work to which we are all called, and which, when we all serve as we are intended transforms us, our church, and our world into what God intends us to be.

Over the years I have valued the writings of an early bishop of the Church of South India, Leslie Newbigin. In one book he compared Pentecost with the striking of oil. He reminds us that when a powerful flow of oil is achieved, there is a lot of excitement and action. It is a big, extravagant (and potentially dangerous) moment. It is cause for uninhibited celebration. A wild scene.

But it is the result that really matters. It must be tamed and delivered to where it is needed. Unless the well is capped, and the oil directed through pipes, the fuss is worth nothing. The pipes running across the land look boring compared with the scene when the oil first flowed free. But that is where the whole event becomes fruitful.

If the oil can be disciplined for the wellbeing of humanity, the strike is worth it.

We thank God for those extravagant exciting moments when we perhaps discover for the first time or in a new way the outpouring of God's Spirit upon us. But unless these wonderful experiences of God's Spirit are channelled into love and service, that special brand of love and service shown by Jesus, then it is of little benefit.

We here today are a Pentecost People.

The Spirit has been and is being poured out upon us.

That Spirit brings to birth the life of Christ in us and Gifts to live out the life of Christ in the world. So let us seek to ever open ourselves up to the working of God's Spirit, to discover the gifts within us and within those around us, and commit ourselves to using them to the Glory of God in order that this church community might truly be a place of blessing to others.
