

REPORT FROM CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council met by Zoom on the 9th of September. While meeting in person is definitely the best way to conduct Church Council meetings we are fortunate that we are able to use technology to continue to 'meet' to do the business of Church Council – and we are getting better at it!

Members of the Dookie Congregation joined with us for the first part of the meeting, and there was considerable discussion around how both congregations can support each other and work together during this time of Covid-19 and during the time of vacancy in the Shepparton Congregation as well as touching on the future of the rural congregations. While no decisions were made there were lots of ideas shared and suggestions offered. There will be more conversation.

Guided by a set of questions from Brian Spencer, the Presbytery Education, Resource and Innovation Support Minister, the Council reviewed the way in which the SUC and Rural Congregations have responded to the Government restrictions around offering opportunities for worship and pastoral care.

It was agreed that the pre-recorded and now Zoom services, the emails and hand-delivered copies of the News and Services have all been well received. The opportunity to engage with Worship from other churches has been a new experience which has been welcomed. It was noted that the services shared on Social Media have been accessed by a wider 'congregation' than just local Shepparton people. The Pastoral Care Teams were commended for their work, which involves lots of phone calls to maintain contact with members of the Congregations. It was acknowledged that people are really missing actually being together, so the opportunity to 'see' each other viz zoom gatherings has been received very well.

It was agreed that more opportunities will be offered for a variety of Zoom gatherings, such as Cuppa and Chat sessions, Bible Study sessions etc.

A report was received from the Maude Street Property Working Group. Uniting have indicated that the Uniting Board has approved the development of the Maude Street premises, within the particular parameters of purchase price and redevelopment costs. The site will be developed to become the Uniting Hub for the North East and Northern area of Victoria.

The preference of the Board is to have the **Responsible Body Status** for the Manse (136 Maude Street) and the Hall/Sacred Space (136-142 Maude Street) transferred from the Uniting Church in Australia Property Trust to Uniting VicTas Property Trust as soon as possible.

The Working Group (Harold Dixon, Kevin Jones, Lorraine Threlfall) has met, via Zoom, with representatives of Uniting (Mark Karutz, Gavin Blakemore, Jennifer Sleep) and the Presbytery (Richard Franklin) twice to work out how this transfer might take place in the best way for both Shepparton Uniting Church and Uniting.

The request from Uniting for Property Valuations for the Manse and the Hall be carried out, with costs to be shared between Uniting and SUC, was approved.

Church Council also approved the recommendation from the Working Group that Property Valuations for the two churches be carried out.

Further developments will be shared as they occur. Please keep the members of the Working Group and Uniting in your prayers as they work through all the issues and implications of the transfer of this property from the Uniting Church Property Trust to Uniting VicTas.
