Thank you everyone for your generous and thoughtful gifts that were presented to John, Leila and myself. I particularly love the book of memories with all the photos and thoughtful contributions. It was certainly the ideal gift. Thank you too for the cards I have received and all the gifts you have given us over the years, gifts of support and encouragement and practical help where needed. The gift that continues to mean the most for me is your love of God and love of others as expressed in a myriad different way.

As I look out and see all the empty chairs I'm sorry that we can't gather in person today, but at the same time in my mind's eye I can see all your faces. Not just your faces but the faces of others with whom I have shared life and ministry over the last 13 years. Faces of people who were part of the congregation when I first came but have since died or moved away but remain part of that great cloud of witnesses that encourages us and spurs us on in the course set before us.

Over the years there have been many who have come and gone and others who have come and joined us in the last couple of years. Whether people have been part of our congregation for only a week or two or part of this community of faith for many decades each one is important, bringing their presence and gifts to our worship and service. I pray that in doing so

they themselves have found blessing, encouragement, and direction for their living.

As I look back over my time with you, there are things I would have liked to have done differently, other things that I didn't get to do. I also want to apologize for any hurt caused along the way. One of the things I thank God for is the way that as a congregation you have, through faith, been open to the leading of God's Spirit to step out in new ways. I am proud of the way that you have worked together through often difficult and challenging times in order to be the congregation you are today.

Despite the restrictions placed on congregational activities due to COVID 19 I believe that as a congregation you are in a good place. You will continue to be blessed through the ministry of Loni and Joan Fisher and whoever else comes to join the team but must importantly through the ministry you share together in Christ's name.

Soon after my arrival in Shepparton I read the booklet titled 'Methodist Church in Goulburn Valley 1873-1977'. What struck me was the question posed by the writer 'What more can be done to promote the work of God in the region?' For me this question is not so much about doing more as, outside of enforced COVID related inactivity, I think that most of you already lead very full and busy lives. For me the 'more' here is about attitude and openness and support for the new opportunities that will and do arise.

At the centenary service of Scots' church in 1985 the message delivered by Rev. Dr. Cliff Simpson concluded with the words 'Walk proudly into the future with high courage, certain that God will guide you.' Words that still apply today.

Thank you for the way you have welcomed, loved and cared for me and my family, including those children who came and went through the foster care program. May God continue to fill you with love for one another and love for all in our community. In whatever activities you undertake may you serve with humility and grace, willing to forgive and be forgiven, as you continue to grow and be shaped by the person and attitude of Christ.
