ASSEMBLY ZOOM PRESENTATIONS Fast or Feast?

October 1

Loni was able to join this webinar at which a key speaker was Revd Dr Geoffrey Thompson, of Pilgrim Theological College who made an extremely helpful presentation on 'virtual Sacraments' - or not. No reports available yet.

The President's Conference

October 3

This webinar was a 'taster' for The President's Conference, postponed from 2020 to early next year. It was to help us reflect on God's call on our lives and how we live our Christian vocation in our particular context. It was in three sessions over Saturday afternoon, EST:

Called by God considered biblical themes of Call and our response to the crises in the contemporary Australian context. Two presenters.

Living our Christian Vocation Six Uniting Church members spoke of their faith and life: Rev Mark Kickett (Chairperson of Congress), Rev Rahika Sukumar-White, Rev Charissa Suli, Ms Catherine Pepper (Sustainability and Smart Cities Leader and environmentalist), Rev Al Macrae and Ms Rhanee Tsetsakos. This group clearly includes Indigenous members, people from SE Asia and the Pacific as well as a scientist and a former President. Their faith stories were memorable!

Faith in Public Life Four Adelaide members and Dr Sureke Goringe, National Director of Uniting World provided amazing stories of the intersection of their faith and public life. Assoc Prof Lorna Hallahan, social worker and disability advocate, working on top Commissions as well as lecturing in Social Work at Flinders University, is disabled - she spoke of a terminal illness at sixteen. Mark Henley is Manager of Advocacy and Communications for Uniting Communities in Adelaide - another passionate advocate. Prof Dr Ian Olver, medical oncologist, cancer researcher, bioethicist and Lay Preacher, spoke of his journey from medicine to research, head of the Cancer Council, bioethicist and also preacher and how each had flowed into the next, in Australia and overseas, although he did not seek it! Rev Deacon Sandy Boyce (Pilgrim Church Adelaide) is President of Diakonia World Federation, and reflected on her work with Deacons around the world.

I had time for only two sessions and was glad I chose the second and third, though doubtless I'd have said that whichever two I attended. All the speakers will be taking part at the real Conference, with the usual time allocation, and opportunities for conversation. Joan
