GOWOLA HOMEWORK CLUB

Gowola Homework Club are seeking volunteers to provide support and educational mentoring for Aboriginal children and youth. The Homework Club, which meets on Tuesdays from 3.50 to 5.00pm, has 45 students, primary and secondary, attending, with 72% attendance rate. Currently there are eight volunteers but more are required so that there can be oneon-one assistance for students needing this level of help. Gowola is a Yorta Yorta word meaning 'kind' or 'kindly'. The Homework Club has now run for four years. It is hoped that there will be 50 students each week, with 25 volunteers.

Gowola Homework Club builds on the strength of existing family relationships within Rumbalara Football Netball Club. It promotes the importance of culture, education and belonging, and provides a culturally safe and supportive environment for students from 'Prep' to Year Ten. At present it is hoped to give extra help to students who may have fallen behind in 2020.
