THE SEASON OF LENT

On Ash Wednesday, February 17, the Church moved into the season of Lent, forty days (not counting Sundays) when the Church pauses to refocus, reflect and refresh on its Journey to Jerusalem to share in the great Paschal Mystery of the Passion, the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. Long ago the tradition of living more simply began - and with using up rich foods such as eggs and cream on Shrove Tuesday - this is the origin of Pancake Day and Mardi Gras (Fat Tuesday) in some other countries. Often the discipline of 'giving up something for Lent' has been observed. In recent times we have encouraged people to take something up for Lent especially Lent studies focussing on the life and death of Jesus Christ. We have two opportunities for studies - those run by Joan Fisher, and the online ones offered by the Presbytery. We are very welcome to do both! The colour for Lent is purple, the colour of penitence and mourning. Since the Early Church, the training of new Christians preparing for baptism culminated during Lent, for baptism at Easter. The President of the Uniting Church offers a prayer for Lent. Read it later in the NEWS. May our faith be blessed, renewed and strengthened this Lent!

PASTORAL PRAYERS

In the Presbytery we pray for the Emmanuekl Wodonga West and Kergunyah. The WCC invites prayers France, Germany and Monaco.

REPORT OF CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 10, 2021

Chairperson Rev Loni Vaitohi opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Shirley Marven led devotions, reflecting on Transfiguration Day.

As always joys and concerns in the life of the congregation were shared, with joy being expressed that: we were able to share in Communion together for the first time in many months; that the various activities of the congregation are resuming again; that new members have been welcomed to worship since face to face worship recommenced. Concern was expressed for members who are experiencing illness and bereavement.

Reports were received from the

Pastoral Care Team which is planning to hold a gathering of all those involved in the visiting teams and any folk who are interested in joining this important ministry. Shirley Marven will provide more details via the *NEWS*.

Property Maintenance Committee, recommending that: consideration be given to installing a TV screen into the Narthex; that the Cross be reinstalled above the servery in the original church; and that a new sign advertising the OP Shop be obtained and fixed to the Fryers St fence. Quotes will be obtained for the installation of an extra screen and the new Op Shop sign. A power source will be required for the Cross as it has back lighting – it was agreed that this work be undertaken.

The Sonder Collective detailing their planning for the coming year and requesting that *Jen and Cam Shields to be able to work with current youth and leaders within the Shepparton UCA congregation to engage in events run under the Sonder Collective banner.*

And that the Shepparton UCA buildings be made available for youth and youth adults' events with association with the Sonder Collective/Sonder Yonder through 2021, both in person and utilising streaming accounts and equipment through the supervision of Jen and Cam Shields. Both requests were approved by consensus.

The Op Shop committee members who are also CC members shared that the Op Shop has held a 'half price' week which was successful, though the amount of donated goods being received is hard to keep up with. They also shared that the Op Shop Hot Water service, installed in 1971, has failed. As the provision of hot water in a workplace is an OHS issue it was agreed that a new, under bench hot water service be installed. Quotes are being obtained for this work to be done.

Other decisions made include

*The appointment of Lea Watts as financial administrator for the Shepparton Uniting Church, noting that there will be a time of hand over between Zane Streeter and Lea and that Zane has generously offered to provide ongoing support for Lea until she has access to bank accounts and has completed the necessary training.

Church Council sincerely thanks Zane for his commitment to the role of Treasurer over the last 7 years, and to Alan and Ellen Cameron for the support they gave to Zane over that time. Alan and Ellen are also thanked for their ongoing support for Lea as she learns the ropes.

*Shepparton Uniting Church will work with Rev Tony Davies, Presbytery Minister for Pastoral Care and Mission to conduct a Mission Study which will enable us to explore the strategy, mission and ministry needs of congregation into the future.

Planning for the Mission Study will begin almost immediately and further information will be shared as it comes to hand.
