REFLECTION

Do you like snakes? Today's story will make some of you uncomfortable; others will be put off, and others will ask questions!

God's people.have been in the wilderness about forty years, now, and are getting very close to the Promised Land. They are walking north up the King's Highway in Jordan. Forced to detour round Edom, the people complain about Moses and God. But God loves them too much to let them get away with this spoilt behaviour. Before they know it, the camp is swarming with snakes, slithering everywhere. People don't realise this until they are bitten and the venom makes them die.

They've just been complaining about Moses, but now they realise he is their only hope, so they confess to him how they complained about him- and that's caused this terrible situation. Moses prays. The snakes don't go away. But if the people have enough faith to look at a snake Moses puts on top of a pole, they won't die. If you put your faith in God, you will find life. It isn't the snake that heals the people, of course, but their faith in God. God heals them.

Lots of us have problems with this story. Surely God doesn't send poisonous snakes to punish people for their complaining or other wrong things! Surely just looking at a snake on a pole won't save you from dying! How does this story make us feel about God, the God with whom we feel really safe?

God's people aren't really convinced that they will get to the Promised Land. So it takes hardly anything for them to complain! And something else to note. The storyteller never actually says God sends the snakes as punishment. It's actually the people who think about punishment.

Why are we even thinking about this strange story? If John hadn't mentioned it, most of us would know nothing about it. We're hearing about it today because people have seen links between this story and Jesus.

First link: Moses points us to Jesus. He has the same spirit as Jesus. He prays for the people. He puts the bronze snake on the pole so those who look at it will live. Secondly, when Jesus is lifted up on the cross, those who look to him will be saved.

Now we come out of the desert into a city. We are not thinking about the children of God, but about one person. This important teacher, Nicodemus, can't make Jesus out. He seeks Jesus out - at night. In their strange conversation, Jesus reminds him of the old snake story from Numbers. To be saved, people had to believe in a central figure - in that case, a bronze snake on a pole.

Jesus tells Nicodemus that salvation will come when another figure is raised up on a pole. Jesus is talking about the cross, at which everyone will be looking. He is saying that people have to look to see Jesus lifted up on a cross, if they want to be saved, to receive new life, eternal life.

Now when Jesus is on that cross, people will react in different ways. None of them will realise that evil, which seems to have triumphed, to have won, will itself be defeated. But they won't know that until after the resurrection, when God's victory over evil makes everything look very different.

So, today, over half-way through Lent, we may well ask, 'Why is Jesus going to Jerusalem?' God's love has prompted him. And because of that love, Jesus has come so we can fulfil our destiny here on earth and later in glory. The light has come, John says. It's your choice whether to live in it or not. If you love darkness, Jesus says, don't look up at me. But if you do look at me, you will find life, you will live in the light.

As we said earlier, there are lots of snakey things in us all. There is poison destroying us, our communities, the planet. Every day we have a choice - to live in denial's darkness or in the light of repentance and faith. Let us remember that our Lent journey calls us to experience God's grace, And we are to see Jesus lifted on the Cross, Jesus resurrected and Jesus ascended to God the

Father! This is the Good News for us today!

EARLY WORD

We're on a journey - a journey through Lent - six long weeks.

Do you sometimes go on a journey in the car? Is it good fun? How do you feel? Do you get tired? What do you ask Mum and Dad?

Are we there yet?

God saved God's people to get them out of Egypt and take them back to their own country. They took a very long time - over 40 years! They 56ravelled up this road! And when Moses said they couldn't take a short cut, but had to go around a long way, they lost it! They grumbled. They blamed God. They said they wanted to go back to Egypt - for better food, for good water. Now some of them were too young to have even lived there.

Suddenly, there were snakes everywhere! If they bit you, you would die. Help us, Moses, they said. Moses didn't get doctors. He prayed to God. God told Moses to get a big pole and to put a big snake on top of it. Anyone who looked at it wouldn't die. And that really happened.

Sometimes we're like those people in the desert. Sometimes we grumble. Sometimes we get snakey with other people.

What snakey things do we have in our lives? If we remember Jesus, and the cross, we won't die, either. The snakey things in us will be made better.
