Reading: John 10: 11 – 18

Sermon:

- The gospel reading for today (John 10: 11-18) does not include verse 10 which is helpful in understanding our passage for today.
- In verse 10, Jesus states "I have come that they may have life and have it more abundantly." This sets the tone for our reading today.
- Today, the fourth Sunday of Easter is known to many as the 'Shepherd Sunday'. The emphasis is on Jesus as the Good Shepherd, the one who lays down his life for his sheep.
- In other words, Jesus is precisely the Good Shepherd because he is the lamb that was slain. And, he did it for the sake of his sheep...that they may have life and have it abundantly.
- In a world where many live unfulfilling lives, lives without meaning or lives that are unsatisfying, Jesus offers abundant life.
- We can tell stories of the times when we wanted and worked so hard to get what we
 thought would be most satisfying and fulfilling and gives meaning to our existence.
 We wait a long time and we finally got it and once we had it, it didn't do what we
 thought it would do or bring with it what we thought it would bring.
- We are still as unhappy as before, there is no joy, it didn't fulfill, and it didn't satisfy. Yes, we got what we wanted but there is no abundance.
- The Psalm for today (Psalm 23) puts it this way..." Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for ever." That is life in abundance.
- Abundant life is life in relationship the Lord... The Lord is my shepherd. It reveals the connection between the Shepherd and the sheep, between us and the holy, and with what's good, true, and beautiful in the world.
- It is not so much about getting what we did not have but living more fully into what is present. It is love that leads to loving. It is about joy that leads to joyful obedience to God. It is about peace that leads to becoming peace makers.
- That is abundant life given in and through the Son of God as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep.
- It is engaging more fully and more deeply into our own lives and the lives of others with love, peace and joy.
- That is the kind of life that never adds to the pain of the world. It is Jesus's way of being in the world as the lamb that was slain. It is the presence of God lived through your life and my life.
- The church as Christ the risen one's body, though scarred, is called and anointed with the Holy Spirit to be the shepherd of God's people.

- The church as the shepherd of God's people is called to lead people to abundant life, always leading to the green pastures, to the still waters, to the table that is set in the presence of the enemies and the cup that is overflowing.
- That abundant life is central to the mission of the shepherd, it is eternal, and it is available. It's always been here, right before us. Sometimes we just need someone to help us find it, to pint to it, to show us that it is already here.
- The contrast between the Good Shepherd and the hired hand is that the hired hand does not own the sheep and does not care for the sheep. If it gets too difficult, too scary, too risky, too "woolfy" the hired hand takes off.
- And the wolves, they come to snatch and scatter. Wolves devour lives and they come in different shapes and sizes.
- Sometimes it is the wolves of fear or busyness. Sometimes it is the wolves of achievement or needing approval. Sometimes it is anger and resentment or maybe the wolves of despair and failure.
- But Jesus, the Good Shepherd says, "I have come that they may have life and have it abundantly." It is promise to each of us and the mandate of his mission to the whole world.
- He is the Good Shepherd for he is the lamb that was slain. He is the Good Shepherd for he has called, equipped and empowered the church to follow him in offering abundant life to all his sheep. That is the good news. Amen.

SERVICE OF BAPTISM

Presentation: (The Elder brings the baptism candidates forward, and introduces them to the congregation)

Riley Geoffrey Fortin and Abby Caroline Fortin have come today to present Riley, Olivia Sophia Heenan and Parker Riley Fortin for baptism.

Scripture:

Hear the words of the Lord Jesus Christ: All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.

The meaning of baptism:

Obeying the word of the Lord Jesus, and confident of his promises, the church baptises those whom he has called.

Riley, do you turn to Jesus Christ, who has defeated the power of sin and death and brought us new life?

I turn to Christ.

Do you pledge yourself to God, trusting in Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord and in the Holy Spirit as Counsellor and Guide?

I pledge myself to God.

Riley and Abby what do you ask of God's church for Olivia and Parker?

We ask that they be baptised into the faith and family of Jesus Christ.

In light of the covenant promise and of your request, I ask you now: Do you believe that the gospel enables us to turn from the darkness of evil and to walk in the light of Christ?

We do.

Riley, Olivia and Parker, may the Lord open your ears to receive his word and your mouths to proclaim his praise.

Let us confess the faith into which we are baptised. (The people stand)

Do you believe in God, who made you and loves you?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, your Saviour and Lord?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, and the continuing work of our salvation?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen. (People remain standing for the act of baptism)

Prayer of Thanksgiving:
(The Elder pours water into the font)

The Lord be with you. **And also, with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Eternal God, we thank you for the gift of water: in the beginning you moved over the waters to bring order out of chaos; from the great flood in the days of Noah you saved those in the

ark; through the Red Sea you led your people to freedom from slavery in Egypt; across the river Jordan you led Israel to the land you promised; in the waters of the Jordan our Lord was baptised by John and anointed by the Holy Spirit.

By the power of the Holy Spirit, bless this water and those who are to be baptised in it; that they may be born anew of water and the Spirit, be raised to new life in Christ, and continue to be his faithful disciples; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

Amen.

Riley Geoffrey Fortin, Olivia Sophia Heenan, and Parker Riley Fortin are now received into the holy catholic Church according to Christ's command.

Almighty God, we praise you for all that you have done for us. We thank you for declaring your love for Riley, Olivia, and Parker. As you have loved them from the beginning, continue to protect and guide them. May they become loyal disciples of Jesus Christ.

We thank you for your goodness to Riley and Abby. Grant your blessing upon their home and help them to keep the promises they have made.

We pray for ourselves who so easily forget your grace, that by sharing in this mystery we may recall our own baptism and continue to walk in the light of Christ and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

Praise be to God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
