Sermon: 'Where did the risen Christ go?'

The gospel of Mark tells us that on that first Easter morning, women went to the tomb to pay their last respect to a dead Jesus. They were surprised to find that Jesus is not there, but a young man dressed in white was. He told them, "You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified? Well, he is not here. He is raised. He is going ahead of you to Galilee."

- Why isn't he going to the palace to see Pilate? To tell him that it is judgement time.
- Why isn't he going to the temple to tell the religious leaders that they got it wrong?
- There is no one in Galilee but his family and the few that followed him.
- He returns to those who disappointed him. To his betrayers. To us!

- The good news of the resurrection is both an empty tomb and the presence of the risen one among us.
- The message of the resurrection is not that 'Because we die, we shall one day return to life. It is, though we were dead, Jesus returned to us.
- The product of the resurrection of Christ is the church that proclaims, 'Christ came back to us!'
- Easter is a reminder that the Christian community, the church, is a choice that the risen Christ has made to come back to us.
- Christians are not people who don't simply know something the world does not yet know or believe something that non-Christians don't yet believe.
- We are the people who have had something happened to us that the world appears not to have yet experienced.
- The implications: When we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, we look up and find that we are not alone. There he is walking with us.
- When we come to some dead end in life, we look over and there he is awaiting us.
 When we give up, give in, and in despair we find him near us!
