BIBLES IN WORSHIP: REMINDER

Regarding the use of Bibles in our worship, here's a reminder of the recommendations made at the January meeting of the Worship Group:

- The Lectern Bible is too heavy to carry. So the Elder on Duty is asked to open_it when the candle is lit before worship; and close it after worship.
- 2. **Two** large print copies of the *New Revised Standard Version* are now available on the table inside the entrance doors, recommended for readers to use during worship. WHY the NRSV? It's based on the most up-to-date and accurate scholarship; and where appropriate it uses language inclusive of women and men. A noted scholar and preacher, William Willimon, describes it as 'God's Word made fresh and accessible for our age.'
- 3. After the last reading, the reader is asked to say either: '*For the word of the Lord thanks be to God';* or '*May your word live in us, and bear much fruit to your glory.*'

The role of these Chaplains is to provide *pastoral care* to the students in the school. Each position is fully funded, the school receiving a grant of \$20,000pa for four years. Training

Some volunteers also require First Aid training (May 11, 9.30-3.30) and Fire Warden training (online, by May 20).
