Winter Night Shelter completed its first week at our venue on Monday June 14. The reports have been glowing, from both Guests and Volunteers across the seven Venues. All agree that it is a wonderful project, which we should have started years ago! The maximum number of guests was five, for two nights; other nights have mainly had four guests.

We were expecting five guests, but one had withdrawn. The Volunteers - three from this congregation and a dozen others - greatly enjoyed meeting and conversing with the guests. The dinner was excellent: one Cook organised her husband to make bread rolls which arrived hot, just at soup time!

All guests slept right through the night - this is something they are really enjoying. We had to wake three at 7.30. But I was concerned that the former church was not warm enough, although we also had the WNS heater running. (At least one other venue was too hot!)

We could use someone to go with the trailer 8.30ish to its home near the cemetery to help the driver unload. If you could help, please let me know.
