#### ASSEMBLY NEWS

#### VALE REVD RON CROXFORD

News has been received that the Revd Ron Croxford, who worked in Shepparton and especially at the Corio Centre, in the mid-1990s, died on May 30 aged 93, after a short illness. He is remembered for his wise leadership and healing ministry at the Corio Centre. A Thanksgiving Service will be held later.

#### JUNE 3 MABO DAY which concludes Reconciliation Week

Eddie Mabo, as we know him, was a Torres Straits Islander, born on Murray Island. When he was 31, he began working as a gardener at James Cook University, Townsville. At that time he and his wife set up Black Community School in Townsville so Indigenous children could learn their own culture. Eddie Mabo spent his free time in the University's library learning about 'White Man's' law. Staff members who realised that he saw himself as an owner of Murray Island told him about Crown Law and later assisted him in working for Land Rights for Indigenous people. After he spoke at a Land Rights conference in 1981, lawyers at the conference suggested that Indigenous land claims be used as a test case in the court system and offered a legal team for this work. It took ten years. Eddie Mabo died on January 21, 1992, aged 55, of cancer. On June 3 that year, the High Court of Australia overturned the terra nullius (nobody's land) understanding of Australia from 1770, recognising the rights of Aboriginal Australians to own and use the land on which their families had lived for millennia. Eddie Mabo was posthumously granted the Human Rights Medal in 1992, and other well-deserved Human Rights honours

I am working to have shorter Overnight units so that some Volunteers need not be at the church all seven hours. If we have enough, it will only be a couple of times a month. The two later versions of the *NEWS* last week indicated that Winter Night Shelter would be delayed by a week, starting Tuesday June 8. Our first night is Monday 13. The project will conclude on August 31, as planned.

Greater Shepparton Winter Night Shelter now has well over 200 Volunteers, with more coming! Fundraising has proved very successful. Please pray for the project - for the Project Director, the Core Project team, the various Co-ordinators, the Venue Co-ordinators and all Volunteers. And pray for our guests!

Guests will register at Beyond Housing who will indicate the names of that night's guests to a Co-ordinator who will relay them to the Venue Coordinator who will advise the drivers who will collect the appropriate bedding and bring it to the venue. The Guests will gather at the Salvation Army, 99 Nixon Street, at 5.30 and be driven to the venue. They will be welcomed by the Evening Shift and will set up their beds. Dinner will be served at 7.00pm. The Evening Shift will socialise with the guests, and offer any help which is sought. At 10.00pm, the Evening and Overnight Shifts change; the doors are locked and guests may not go out to smoke. During the night, two of the three Overnight Volunteers must be awake at all times.

The Breakfast Shift arrives at 7.00am; guests may go out to smoke. After breakfast, guests are responsible for attending to their bedding, assisted by the Breakfats Volunteers. Cleaning is done. Guests and Volunteers leave the venue at 9.00am, the guests being driven to the Salvation Army.

A volunteer may not be alone with a guest. Procedures are in place in case there is any inappropriate behaviour or any health problem. As I've indicated, we have the Building and Temporary Occupancy Permits and the hard-wired smoke detectors have been installed. All good!
