**BIBLE READINGS:** John 6:24-35

### REFLECTION

In today's gospel reading we find Jesus surprising people again - not by what he does, but by what he says. They have already participated in the surprise of their lives - being fed by a simple offering of five loaves and two fish. Then, after this miraculous feeding of the large crowd, Jesus leaves. The crowd naturally wants more of him, and they follow him, eventually finding him on the other side of the lake. What they hear comes as a different sort of surprise.

First, Jesus accuses them of opportunism: "Ah, you're only here because you want another free meal," he scolds. And, he was probably right. He goes on: "Do not work for the food that spoils, instead, work for the food that lasts for eternal life."

That gets their attention. "Okay," the crowd says, "we'll go with you on this one, what kind of work do we have to do to get this food?"

"Just believe," Jesus says, "just believe that I am the One God sent." At this point the crowd baulks, wondering just who in the world this person thinks he is. He is, after all, offering the bread of life.

But what if he's wrong? What if they believe, and don't receive?

This promise of the bread of life is both frightening and comforting, for it raises expectations. So, naturally, they ask "what miracle will you perform so that we may see it and believe you?"

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>12</sup> Your help made me so happy. Give me that joy again. Make my spirit strong and ready to obey you.

In other words, "Prove yourself, Jesus." How much easier faith would be if God would just do what God's supposed to do and give us a miracle.

And Jesus response? I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.

God is a God of surprises, of upheavals, of reversals. And so rather than do what God is supposed to do - like another bread- breaking miracle - God does the unexpected: instead of pronouncing judgment, God offers mercy; instead of justice, God loves; instead of condemnation, God forgives, instead of coming in power, God came in weakness; and instead of giving us a miracle, God gives us God's own self. For as Martin Luther would remind us, the whole of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection are summed up both succinctly and eloquently in the two words we hear when coming to the communion table: "for you." *This is Christ's body, given for you. This is Christ's blood, shed for you.* 

We will shortly share the sacrament of holy communion today, a special meal which reminds us of the faith we are privileged to proclaim: that the Eternal Word who was with God and is God from the beginning and participated in the creation of the heavens and the earth is the same Lord who cares so desperately for us that he gave his life for ours on the cross, and gives himself still in the bread and wine.

Both the sacraments which we practice in the Uniting Church – Communion and Baptism - contain God's unexpected, surprising, unforeseen gift of God's own self.

So today – we, the body of Christ with different gifts and abilities, but one in Christ, have the privilege of receiving the surprise of our lives. Soon, we will be invited to partake of the bread of life, and as we do, let us remember this awesome promise - that those who come to Christ will never be hungry, and those who believe in Christ will not thirst. Thanks be to God. Amen
