COMMISSIONING OF ELDERS AND CHURCH COUNCILLORS

There are diverse gifts:

(The names of the candidates are read out and the candidates stand together facing the congregation)

Brothers and sisters, the congregation has elected you to serve Jesus Christ as elders and church councillors.

Your responsibilities include the following:

to share with the minister(s) in building up the congregation in faith and love; to nurture the members in their growth in grace; to visit regularly members and adherents; to share with the minister in the conduct of worship and the administration of the sacraments, the spiritual oversight of the congregation, and in Christian education and evangelistic outreach; to maintain the membership rolls of the congregation and to exercise pastoral discipline; to make recommendations regarding applicant for training for ministry.

THE VOWS

Do you confess anew Jesus Christ as Lord?

I do.

Do you believe that you are called by God through the church to this ministry? **I do.** 

Will you seek to live and work within the faith and unity of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church?

I will.

Do you adhere to the Basis of Union of the Uniting Church in Australia? **I do.** 

Relying on God's grace, do you promise to carry out the duties of your office? **I do.** 

(The people stand)

Will you the members of this congregation, accept these brothers and sisters as elders and church councillors?

We will.

Will you encourage them in love and support them in their ministry, serving with them the one Lord Jesus Christ?

We will.

May God give you strength to fulfil these vows; and to him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus from generation to generation for ever.

Readings: 2 Samuel 5: 1-5, 9-10; Mark 6: 1-13

## Sermon brief:

- David's coronation on Mount Hebron happened without a crown or sceptre to pass down nor the fanfare of today's royal coronations (2 Samuel 5)
- He is the Lord's anointed, recognized by the elders to reign for forty years in Jerusalem
- David the blood-stained warrior who carried the severed head of Goliath back to Jerusalem was ruthless and not to be worshipped.
- The great leader, the mighty warrior, the poet and musician is no model on non-violence.
- David's greatness was because the Lord, the God of hosts, was with him.
- In the end, it is not how the world sees David, or how David may see the world, but how God chose, anoint and empowered his servant.

- David served the Lord, the God of hosts.
- Jesus also was chosen, anoint and served the Lord, the God of hosts.
- Our gospel story from Mark 6 portrays Jesus' hometown folks misunderstood Jesus.
- The hometown folks knew a lot about him where he is from 'the carpenter' the son of Mary'.
- The rejection by his hometown synagogue cannot stop the mission Jesus is called to, nor their lack of faith.
- For Mark, here in chapter 6, faith is not a necessary element in the healing mission of Jesus.
- God's freedom to act cannot be limited in that sense.
- The strategies of God's mission is spelled out in Mark 6: 7 13. Jesus is preparing them for potential rejection.
- Just as the established religious traditions and authorities were not always susceptible to God doing a new thing.
- Wherever there is rejection, there is judgement 'shake off the dust from your feet'.
- How the hometown folks see Jesus and the way they defined and characterised him is common in our world.
- As the church of Jesus Christ, we are called to mission whether people believe or not. That is not up to us.
- We carry out God's mission, even if rejected by our very own.
- Jesus was rejected, crucified but risen the ultimate revelation of God's power. That is the power entrusted to God's servants.
