GREATER SHEPPARTON WINTER NIGHT SHELTER

August 9: our biggest night yet! Seven Guests, including one with broken ribs on his first night at the Shelter - he'd been hit by a car the previous week. It was a joy to give three of the new air conditioning units a workout they were gladly welcomed by those who have spent the last two months with us in less than warm comfort most nights. One who had been well clothed the previous week arrived in bare feet. A Volunteer went home to get socks - my store had been used - but he'd gone out, returning at 9.15pm and great delight to have socks. Jeni was on Breakfast Tuesday so took him to the Op Shop for shoes, new jeans - his only pair had split overnight - undies - had none - and kitted him out beautifully. I met our Central Queensland Guest by chance, took him to collect his bag of clothes from Mooroopna and heard bits of why he is not at home - was caught up in Robodebt, has lost his car and is part of a Robodebt class action, so can't return yet. I advised the Salvation Army Captain; we spoke of Legal Aid. So you see our varied Winter Night Shelter experiences! Please continue to pray for Greater Shepparton Winter Night Shelter, the seven venues, all Guests and, of course, the wonderful Volunteers. And also the Project Co-ordinator, Deputy, Project Team Volunteer Co-ordinator and all others who have special tasks.
