ASSEMBLY NEWS AUGUST 19 - MESSY CHURCH

Messy Church was featured as one of the ways our church shares its Intergenerational Ministry. You may not know that Messy Church began in the UK in 2004 and was introduced to Australia in 2010. It has thrived as a creative, practical model for local congregations and communities seeking to nurture faith and build relationships across generations. Messy Church

was begun to engage families with no links to the more formal church services. There are now 3,700 known Messy Church communities in 30 countries. The National Church Life Survey records that 90 of these are in the Uniting Church in Australia. As you will realise, this congregation began Messy Church very soon after it reached Australia, thanks to Rosalie, Anni and the Young Church group. St Augustine's visited - and have begun their community. Please keep Messy Church in your prayers each month.
