GROWING UP UNITING: a new narrative for our Church

For many years a powerful narrative about the ageing profile of our communities has been shaping the UCA', writes Bethany Broadstock,' but the collection of essays in the newly published book *Growing Up Uniting* reminds us of the new generations that call the Uniting Church home. Their reflections offer a glimpse into their experiences and their hopes for a movement that is committed to "walk into the future." *Assembly News 8/9*

At Shepparton, we know that we have members in every generation, from birth to 100! (Adelaide, is not alone in being under one year: Jayden, Zawadi and Nial are sons in three of our Congolese families. And there's Lucy, a little older. But many of the congregations where I take services have no-one under 60 - or even older! We are truly blessed! But now read more from Assembly News.

In her review of this new publication, Bethany Broadstock notes the following:

- In some places this absence of the younger generations has been a focus for how our communities, structures and the Gospel are made accessible to each stage of life.
- *Growing Up* reminds us that from the earliest days of the UCA, this Church has been home to whole new generations. Some were born into the UCA; others have chosen it as the context for their life of faith. They have been shaped by its life and values and have gone on to make their contributions. (Bethany is one of these.) Think of those in our congregation.

Growing Up Uniting is an anthology of personal essays written by twenty members aged 18 to 40, the first two generations 'to be formed personally, spiritually and theologically in the Uniting Church.' So there is 'a balanced collection of insights... which hold a mirror to the church.' They celebrate our Uniting identity and call us to reflect on where the Spirit is leading us today.

- The writers list the sense of belonging, openness to questions, commitment to justice and Covenant with First Peoples, liberating biblical engagement and a courageous public voice, women's leadership, an Open Communion Table among the things forming our identity.
- There is also critique: aversion to risk, creeping corporatisation, topheavy bureaucratisation, and loss of imagination, as possible threats to our identity. Is there a failure to invest in the faith formation of young people and to mentor them, or of being unwilling to form them for Christian discipleship?
- but there is willingness to be forward-facing... And there is much more!

Bethany Broadstock notes that the book is timely, given the *Act2 Project*, (mentioned in this *NEWS* from time to time.) You can find out about the project on the Assembly website.

Some of us need to purchase this book and share its insights!
