### **NEWS FROM UNITING, SHEPPARTON**

You may have read the article *Tackling Domestic Violence*, *Shepparton News*, Tuesday, October 5. It describes the work being done by Uniting VicTas' Family Violence Intervention Program in Shepparton. The article is on the church notice board. This program is being run at Fryers Street, led by Katie Richter who is helping men who treat women badly to explore how they need to change, so that they make the change themselves. The program is based on *No To Violence*, whose Chief Executive Jacqui Watt says men are not born violent but may become violent because of social and environmental factors.

The Uniting release thanks us for letting Uniting share our space - the store room and hall, for this program - as well as the Meeting Room. The Men's Behaviour Change Program will run in the hall several nights a week; there will be client appointments in the store room - for individual interviews. Men's Behaviour Change is a group for me who have used Family Violence. The men sit together and share their stories. These men have used controlling and harmful behaviours in their relationships, and want to make positive change to become better men and fathers. The groups are a safe space for men to talk about their behaviours and the effects these have on the women and children in their lives. Program leaders will work full time at Fryers Street. They will hold client appointments for the Family Violence Program Monday at 1.00, 2.00 and 4.00pm; Tuesday 4.00pm; Wednesday 10.00am, 2.00pm and Thursday all day. ### UNITED NATIONS CLIMATE CHANGE CONFERENCE.

COP26 This week has heard further discussion about whether the Prime Minister will attend this important conference in Glasgow in November. Meanwhile Assembly News continues its presentation *Towards Zero Episode 2*, the Journey Towards Zero Emissions, supporting congregations to take action. Church and faith leaders have joined calls for climate justice - to achieve net-zero carbon emissions as soon as possible, and to limit the global average temperature rise to 1.5 degrees above pre-industrial levels. Almost 40 faith leaders including Pope Francis, the World Council of Churches, other church leaders and leaders from Sunni and Shi'a Islam, Judaism, Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism and Confucianism and more released *Faith and Science: An Appeal for COP26* on October 4. ### PLENARY COUNCIL FIRST ASSEMBLY OCTOBER 3-10

**2021** You may have heard news from this most important meeting of Australian Catholics taking place this week. A Plenary Council is the highest form of gathering for the Catholic Church in any country. This one is the first in Australia since 1937. Pope Francis has invited the Australian Church to dialogue about its future, given the changes to society and how the Catholic Church is seen, especially in relation to the Royal Commission on Child Sexual Abuse, and also the Church's shrinking attendances and shortage of priests. A very pressing matter is the role of women! Another is the autocracy of the episcopacy (bishops). This week, 280 members of the Plenary Council - Bishops, priests. members of religious orders and lay people - including women! from round Australia are meeting online and in some face-to-face meetings to discuss 16 questions round six national themes. Besides these voting members there ae advisers and observers. Local groups have been listening and discussing the future of the Church for over three years providing insights for the national themes.

In some ways this is similar to the Uniting Church Assembly - almost 300 mostly elected members from all Synods and presbyteries, discussing matters concerning the role and life of the Church. But Assemblies take place every three years, with an elected Standing Committee to act between these Assemblies.

The Second Plenary Council Assembly is now planned for July 2022. You can pray for these last days of the Council, catch online sessions - and talk to your Catholic friends about it!

### Live streaming worship.

Following comments about the audio and video quality of the services being live-streamed via the Zoom platform, it has been decided to trial a different process to improve the reception qualities.

Zoom is an excellent programme for discussion and catching up with one another, which is what it was designed for, but has some issues with the transmission of data such as music or film. A zoom link for people to join in to for conversation after worship will still be sent out.

This Sunday, the service will be live-streamed via the Youtube platform.

The following procedure will need to be followed to be able to watch the service.

On your computer, ipad or mobile phone, open up a browser such as Google or Safari

Type <a href="https://www.youtube.com/user/SheppartonUniting">www.youtube.com/user/SheppartonUniting</a> into the search box and tap the enter or return key

Once the morning's worship service goes 'live' a link with the video will be shown just under the Shepparton Uniting Church 'Banner' click this link to be taken to the morning worship service

To make the video box fill the whole computer screen or lpad or computer screen, using your mouse, (or finger for those using a phone or ipad) click on the 'screen' icon in the bottom right hand corner of the service and you will be able to watch on full screen. Below is a screen shot of the Screen icon.



The zoom link will be open from 10.30am, so after worship has concluded, make a cuppa and join in to Zoom for a conversation with others from our congregation.
