MULANA NIN LYOGA WALKING TRAIL MT MAJOR From

Opened in 2020, it is supported by Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority, Yorta Yorta Aboriginal Corporation, Greater Shepparton City Council, and the University of Melbourne Dookie Campus. CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT RE THE MAUDE ST PROPERTY

Work is proceeding well to fulfil the requirements of City of Greater Shepparton to subdivide the property at 136 to 162 Maude St, Shepparton.

The original plan was to realign the title boundaries to give 4 separate, 'workable' titles to allow the land to be sold in 4 lots. [the original boundaries for two of the blocks ran along the walls of the buildings and the portion of the building housing the Settlement Hub was built across the boundary]

Following negotiation with Uniting for Uniting to enter into a Ground Lease arrangement with us for the buildings and land at 136 and 142 Maude St, it was decided that the application to subdivide should be amended to 3 lots, leaving the Manse at 136 Maude St on its existing title.

Council requirements to provide separate power and water connections to each of the lots are well in hand,

The next step is to complete the Synod Property Services Form 3F -Permission to Sell, which requires the signatures of the Chair and Secretary of Church Council confirming that the Church Council recorded a decision to sell the property at 156 and 162 Maude St (Wesley Church and the old Church)

The following decisions were made at a specially convened Church Council meeting held via zoom on Tuesday, 28th of September:

Shepparton Uniting Church Council resolves to sell the land and buildings at 150 and 162 Maude St, (Lots 2 and 3 PS900114S on the plan of subdivision) Shepparton. (Consensus)

It was resolved that the Maude St Working Group liaise with the Property Maintenance Committee to organise and prepare the buildings for sale. (Consensus)

Form 3F will be forwarded to the Presbytery Property and Finance Committee for its endorsement and then it will be sent to the Synod PART (Property Applications Review Team) for their attention. PART will advise us of the procedure they wish us to follow from here on.
