GOVERNMENT VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS - VOLUNTEERS

Lorraine thanks the latest group of Volunteers who have given their Vaccination details to her. It is a Government requirement that Volunteers submit vaccination details: their second vaccination date, vaccination certificate number, type of vaccine OR date of first vaccination and appointment date for second OR exemption certificate number. Please give any outstanding ones to Lorraine who will keep them confidential.

VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

People without mobile phones may be interested to know that credit cardsized certificates are available from Ken Faulkner, PrintWorks, \$5.00.

NUMBERS WHO MAY ATTEND WORSHIP

For a congregation where everyone is doubly vaccinated, or has a medical exemption, seating spacing is one person per 4 sq metres. This means 49 people may sit, suitably spaced, in the church; a further 27 may worship in the narthex, suitably spaced.

Should there be anyone not meeting the government's vaccination requirements, the maximum who may be in the building for worship is 30.

Morning tea will not be served after worship until further notice. Those planning to come to worship may like to join friends at a coffee shop or invite them home for morning tea.

RETURNING TO CHURCH - NOVEMBER 14, 2021

As the state of Victoria moves towards reopening and our requirements around COVID management are released we encourage you all to keep safe and get vaccinated if possible.

The Shepparton Uniting Church will re-open the church for in person services on Sunday 14th November at our usual time of 9:30am for members of the public who have received both doses of the vaccination, or have a certified medical exemption.

After much discussion and deliberation, the Church Council felt this was the best way to reopen while keeping our must vulnerable members of the community safe.

Services will continue to be live streamed and recorded for those who cannot or wish not to attend in person worship and found at www.youtube.com/user/SheppartonUniting and worship material will be available from both our Facebook page and website. Alternatively, a printed copy of worship material will be available for those without access to online options. Please contact Shirley or Joan if you would like to have a hard copy delivered each week.

All information regarding the requirements of entry, density limits will be clearly displayed on all entry points to the building and published in the newsletter and on the website.

The latest information from the Synod of Vic/Tas Crisis Management Team (published 28/10/21) regarding numbers in the building is:

Religious gatherings and ceremonies -As of October 28:

- •If all attendees are fully vaccinated, the number of people who may attend is based on a density quotient of one person per 4 sqm indoors. Up to 500 people may attend outdoors with a density quotient of one person per 2 sqm
- *If the vaccination status of all attendees is not known*, up to 30 people may attend, with a density quotient of one person per 4sqm
- **COVID check-in marshals** must ensure all attendees check-in and, if it is a service for the fully vaccinated, that all attendees over 16 have proof they are fully vaccinated or medically exempt.
