**Readings:** Isaiah 62: 1-5, Psalm 36: 5-10, John 2: 1 – 11

Sermon: 'From the ordinary to a miracle'

- The gospel reading from John does not offer us any details about the wedding, whose wedding it was. Neither the groom or the bride is mentioned, or even the steward. But, the mother of Jesus is mentioned, and it is not clear whether Jesus was invited.
- Preparation for a wedding are meticulous, with much more thought given to guests list, catering venue and the reception, the clothes to wear before they head to church for the ceremony.
- Marriage couples would be horrified at the thought of running out of food or drink for their guests.
- The couple at Cana would be just as horrified at the thought that their hospitality was insufficient, especially if the whole town of Galilee and all the extended family and friends were invited.
- Anyhow, in Cana, disaster strike! The wedding ran out of wine. Running out of wine bring shame to the newlyweds and their families. Because it says that they don't care and therefore insulting their guests, or it says that we are too poor to supply sufficient wine.
- Mary finds out, which gives us a clue that Mary may have been a close relative or had something to do with the task of supplying the wine. She saw the problem with all its implications and told Jesus about it.
- Mary spoke to the servants, "Do as he tells you". The servants did follow their orders, and wine was produced, only this time the wine is better than the wine that was served earlier.
- The family was saved from embarrassment, shame, and guilt. Instead, they will be remembered for providing the best and most wonderful wine ever drunk in Cana.
- In the gospels, wine often symbolises the blood of Jesus and we do so too in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper with the words, "Drink from this all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant which is poured out for you and for many.:
- The wine in Cana flowed in abundance to save from embarrassment, guilt and shame. The sacrifice of Jesus Christ was made once for all on the cross, not limited to a few, not stingy, not limited to those of us in the church, but available to all who confess that Jesus is Lord.
- We take our shortcomings to him in prayer, we listen to him through the preaching of the word, and we do what he commands us to do.
- Those who are invited to the wedding feast are blessed. The invitation is not given in a rush, not hastily given to someone that has been forgotten, but given graciously to us all.
- And we are instructed to pass on that invitation "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Teaching them all that I have commanded you."
- Jesus can transform our lives from the ordinary to miraculous living. We can dance in celebration every day of our lives because of the abundant grace we receive without merits.

# **Children's Baptism:**

# Presentation:

(The elder responsible for the care of the families brings the parents and children to be baptised forward, and introduces them to the congregation)

Alarna Macklin and Reilly Pethybridge are here also to present their daughter Layla Maree Pethybridge for baptism.

# Scripture:

Hear the words of the Lord Jesus Christ: All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.

# The meaning of baptism:

Obeying the word of the Lord Jesus, and confident of his promises, the church baptises those whom he has called.

Baptism is a sign of new life in Christ Jesus. By water and the Holy Spirit, we are brought into union with Christ in his death and resurrection.

In baptism we are sealed with the Holy Spirit, made members of the body of Christ, and called to his ministry in the world.

# **Renunciation and Affirmation:**

Greg and Nattalie, what do you ask of God's church for Florence and Delilah? We ask that they be baptised into the faith and family of Jesus Christ.

Reilly and Alarna, what do you ask of God's church for Layla? We ask that they be baptised into the faith and family of Jesus Christ.

In the light of the covenant promise and of your requests, I ask you now:

Do you believe that the gospel enables us to turn from the darkness of evil and to walk in the light of Christ?

We do.

Florence, Delilah and Layla, may the Lord open your ears to receive his word, and your mouths to proclaim his praise.

# The minister says to the parents and the congregation:

The people stand.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, your Saviour and Lord?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.



On the third day he rose again; he ascended to heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, and the continuing work of our salvation? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The people remain standing.

# **Prayer of Thanksgiving:**

By the power of the Holy Spirit, bless this water and those who are baptised in it; that they may be born anew of water and the Spirit, be raised to new life in Christ, and continue to be his faithful disciples; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

We thank you for your goodness to Nattalie, Greg, Alarna and Reilly. Grant your blessing upon their homes and help them to keep the promises they have made.

We pray for ourselves who so easily forget your grace, that by sharing in this mystery we may recall our own baptism and continue to walk in the light of Christ and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. Praise be to God,

the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
