SERMON – A NEW COMMANDMENT

SERMON SUMMARY NOTES – Sunday 15th May 2022

- The theme for the 16th Assembly 'Dwelling in Love' offers us an opportunity to reflect on how God's love dwells in us, with us, and amongst us as followers of Jesus Christ. As Geoff Thompson (Uniting Church Theologian) said, "Love is central to both our understanding of God and Jesus, and of our practice of Christian discipleship."
- In that love of God in which we dwell, we share our joys and bear one another's burdens, and it unites us in a commonwealth that abides in that love.
- Our gospel reading for this Sunday (John 13: 31-35), John reminds us of how Jesus lived in that love by demonstrating how that love looks like in real life. For example, Jesus knew who was going to betray him and he responded by feeding the betrayer: "So when he had dipped the piece of bread, he gave it to Judas son of Simon Iscariot" (13:26).
- Jesus knew that his hour is coming to depart from this world and return to his Father and he responded by getting up from the dinner table, takes on the role of a slave, and washes the disciple's feet. Having loved his own, he loved them to the end (13: 3)
- Jesus also knows that Peter will deny him.
- Jesus's departing words were not of blame for the past and future failures, but of reassuring his disciples that they will not be abandoned.
- Then Jesus gave them a new commandment "that you love one another as I have loved you."
- The love that Jesus speaks of and demonstrated in his life and death, is a love that extends from the simple and mundane things in life and encompasses every kind of self-giving act of love.
- It is by this kind of love that everyone will know that they are his disciples. (John 13:35)
