Many of us remember the exciting service when we filled the Civic Centre (Eastbank) with 1,000 worshipping together on June 22, 1977. Others have grown up knowing only the Uniting Church! And yet others have joined this church after coming as immigrants or refugees. As the theme for this year's anniversary proclaims, *All of this is us!*

REFUGEE WEEK June 19-25

Refugee Week celebrates the many contributions refugees make to the Australian community. We are grateful for the refugees who joined the Wesley congregation in August 2006: Uzembe Byamasu, Jeannette Mwavita and their children and, later, grandchildren; Mauldi Mukasa, and his six children (Fitina is a Case Manage at Uniting Shepparton; Neema is a nurse at GV Health); later Namulika came to marry Maulidi – they now worship at the Baptist Church. Then Nathan Mwamba and later his brother Emmanuel and sister Roseline and their families arrived. Uzembe and Maulidi and their families had been in refugee camps in Tanzania for a decade or more before being allowed to come to Shepparton as two of fifteen Congolese refugee families. Nathan, Emmanuel and Roseline fled their home in southern Congo and lived as refugees in Namibia for many years before coming to Shepparton.

You doubtless know other former refugees who have given so much to Shepparton community. We thank God for them, and that we are able to welcome them.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT, JUNE 2022

Church Council met on the 8th of June and opened with a welcome and Acknowledgement of Country. Bron Fisher led us in a time of devotion, reflecting on John 8:31-36 and the freedom which comes from dependence on God for God's love, mercy, grace and strength.

Bron Fisher, Rob Graham and Gail Jones were welcomed as newly elected Church Councillors, with Bron and Gail both returning for a second term on the Council. Retiring Church Councillor, Lorraine Threlfall was thanked for

her contribution to the Church Council over her term as an Elder. Life Elder Alan Cameron was warmly thanked for his commitment and contribution to the life of the Shepparton, Scots and St Andrews Uniting Church congregations since Union in 1977 and to the Presbyterian congregations prior to Union. Alan continues to hold the title of Elder, but has asked to be excused from attending meetings. Loni led the Council in a prayer of thanksgiving for Alan's gifts and graces.

Rev Loni Vaitohi was elected as Chair of the Church Council, Jen Shields was elected as Minute Secretary and Shirley Marven accepted the role of 'Keeper of the Rolls'.

Members watched a short video introducing the new resource 'Meeting Together – a Workbook for Councils, Committees and Groups' which has been produced by the Presbytery Ministers who are part of the Synod eLM (equipping Leadership for Mission) Committee. Church Council believe that this will be a valuable resource for our Congregation so a number of the booklets will be ordered for the use of our various groups.

A meeting will be held with the Dookie Congregation on June the 15th to discuss the future relationship between the Dookie and Shepparton Congregations, following the closure of the Katandra West and Pine Lodge congregations.

Reports were received from the minister, the Youth, Children's and Family Committee and the Treasurer.
