DOOKIE 9.30 Rev Dr Helen Malcolm SUNDAY, JUNE 12 TRINITY

This Church festival is different from all the others because it is concerned with theological ideas about God, that is, who God is, Father, Son and Spirit. The other festivals commemorate an actual historical event of salvation. Trinity was first observed by the Western Church in the tenth century, but it was not adopted by the Roman Church until the fourteenth century, because an eleventh century Pope, Alexander II, was not convinced it was a valid development. The Sundays after Trinity are usually known as 'after Pentecost'.
