GREATER SHEPPARTON WINTER NIGHT SHELTER

The 2022 Winter Night Shelter programme concluded on August 31 after three months' working with the homeless in this community. Our last night was Monday 29.

The Monday team has included six from the Congregation – Joan Fisher, Jeni Fitzgerald, Gail Jones, Denise Naish, Elaine Brewster and me; we have been joined and supported by 13 Volunteers from other churches and the community. As for 2020 and 2021, the plan was to offer accommodation seven nights a week, but with only one guest, the Winter Night Shelter Board and Venue Co-ordinators decided to instead offer meals seven nights a week at the Lake barbecue shelter at 5.30pm. This has been very successful in that greater numbers , including women, have been assisted with meals and other necessities. Twenty guests have been fed and have shared in conversation as part of this new community. Our highest number has been 11. On Mondays we have served soup and a main course, followed by dessert; packs of surplus food have been welcomed by our guests, as have the hot drinks.

The participating churches are Seventh Day Adventist (Sunday); Mooroopna – St Mary's Catholic sharing nights with the Uniting Church (Tuesday); St Brendan's (Wednesday); several churches (Thursday); St Mel's (Friday) and the Salvation Army (Saturday).

The organisers are very aware that the barbecue shelter is not a satisfactory location for the distribution of food – the shelter is limited, it receives winds from all quarters and rainwater flows from the road down through the side of the shelter where the tables are, so there have been very wet feet some nights. It's also too far for some of the homeless to walk to. It is hoped to have a better location in 2023.

As our Venue Co-ordinator, I offer warmest thanks to the Congregation for their support and willingness to assist. I note that this is one activity where the volunteers always arrive smiling! Joan
