Next Thursday, October 13, people of faith across Australia and the Pacific will jointly call for actions to protect creation ahead of global climate talks at COP27 in November. Faith leaders are calling on the Australian Government to stop approving new coal and gas projects and to actively support a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty. Multi-faith services are taking place on Thursday at prominent places of worship; these include a service at St Paul's Cathedral from 5.10 to 5.30pm Thursday.
