He commenced radiotherapy this week, however the outlook is poor and a time frame of approximately 4 months has been given.

Loni reassures us that while this is not the news he was hoping to receive, he is confident in God's love and grace.

The Vaitohi family regards the Shepparton Uniting Church as their home and Loni has encouraged them to 'lean on the Church' during the days ahead.

We, the people of the Shepparton Uniting Church, assure Loni, Moti, Lavinia, Joey, Danny and Henry, and the little ones, of our prayers, love and support.

GREETINGS FROM KERRIE

Hello. Today you will receive a printed copy of the news announced to the congregation on 5th February. It is printed in the newsletter because there are some people who did not hear the report on Loni's health. Reading it is not the easiest way, but hearing it second hand is also not easy. If this is the day you receive the news, know that we as a congregation can and will be praying for each other. If you need pastoral support - a need to connect

and talk - reach out to someone, or call me. My number is on the newsletter.

Joan Fisher and I have arranged for a couple of half-hour prayer sessions during the weeks leading up to Easter. We originally planned on three per week, but changed it to two, as we have opportunity to pray together on Sundays too. You will find accurate day/ times in this week's newsletter. The prayer sessions are to enable us to pray for those in our congregation, and for situations in our region and for those very concerning situations we hear in world news. News of adversity can take up all our attention to the point of forgetting about all the good and wonderful things with which we are blessed... or the things we can do to be a blessing on others.

Depending on when you read this, Presbytery will be/will have occurred on Saturday. Some very important conversations will be had at that meeting which is open to leaders of congregations as well as elected members of Presbytery.

Last week, Don and I travelled to Wodonga to attend the induction of Rev. Hee Yung. In March there will be another induction in this Presbytery. Watch for news in a future newsletter.

I am on a deadline to get my letter out for printing today, and working on a computer that takes time to start up and be ready for the day. REPORT FROM FEBRUARY CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

Church Council met on February 8 and it was resolved that Shirley Marven would act as Chairperson in the absence of Rev. Loni. Lea Watts led devotions reflecting on Rev. Gereldine Leonard's monthly letter to the congregations.

Church Council was delighted to recognise Josh and Narelle Freeman as Members in Association, co-opt Narelle to Church Council and appoint her as secretary.

Church Council spent some time reflecting on the latest news in regards to Loni's illness, and spent time in prayer for Loni, his family and the congregation.

We received with some sadness the news that Rev. Joan Fisher will conclude her role as Minister in Association. We have been blessed with Joan's ministry and leadership for the last seven years and are thankful that she will remain an active member of our congregation.

Reports were received from the Minister, the Worship Group, the Youth, Children's and Family Committee, the Young Adults' Committee, Property and Maintenance Committee, the Treasurer and the Project Control Group (Op Shop).

Decisions made arising from the reports include:

- a. The Op Shop will operate from the Old Church during the building of the new Op Shop, with temporary walls being installed to separate the temporary Op Shop from the Hospitality Space and to provide a designated sorting space. Clothing racks and shop fittings will be transferred from the old Op Shop to the temporary Op Shop. Entry will be through the west door of the Old Church. Church Council will apply for Property Sales Proceeds from the sale of the Maude St property to cover all the costs.
- b. The Wesley Organ Committee has been dissolved and transferred money from the Organ Account to Shepparton Uniting Church with a request that it be used to purchase a new organ/musical instrument. A task group will be appointed to investigate the purchase of an organ/

musical instrument that will best suit the needs of our congregation.
