# LORRAINE'S REPORT OF PANCAKE DAY

More than 60 people from the congregation, Uniting VicTas and friends gathered on Tuesday evening to enjoy dessert pancakes and a time of fellowship. Many thanks to the Catering Team for providing the delicious pancakes and toppings, and to the Uniting VicTas Team who served us. The Uniting Team engaged in some 'speed dating' type exercises by moving from table to table to share aspects of their work. We heard from Alison, Team Leader for the Men's Behaviour Change Programme, about the work of this programme. Other members of the Uniting Team spoke briefly about their roles in the community. Thanks also to Don and Kerrie for providing a portable speaker system so that all those who spoke could be heard. The evening was a fundraiser for Uniting and to date \$605 has been raised. This money will be used to provide various types of vouchers to participants in the Men's Behaviour Change Programme. There is still time to contribute to the Pancake Day Fundraiser if you wish to - just put your donation into an envelope marked Pancake Day and place it in the Offering bowl at Church, or hand it to Lorraine or Lea.

**LENT** is the period of 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Good Friday in which Christians commemorate the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert – fasting and being tempted about how he would engage in ministry- before his public ministry began. Traditionally, Christians have fasted, given up certain luxuries and given alms (gifts to the needy) in what was called the

Lenten sacrifice. These days the focus is also on 'what more' can form part of our spiritual life – more prayer, especially; finding aspects of our self which are less Christ-like and letting them die. And we join in Lenten studies. In all of these our focus is on the sufferings and death of Jesus. Uniting Church Act2 Project Lead Andrew Johnson reflects on Lent as an invitation to make space for the new thing God is doing among us. May we all be blessed in our journey this Lent.
