Hello. Last Sunday afternoon a group of people from our congregation travelled to Benalla to join the farewell service of Kelvin Hodge. The service was uplifting, with Kel indicating at one point in the sermon just how out of the ordinary the past several years have been, and inviting us to giggle at this contrast to the usual perceptions of a rural placement.

On Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, the congregation of Shepparton farewelled Ailsa Cook in a memorial service jointly led by Rev Kerrie and Ailsa's son-in-law Jim. At the graveside service I spoke on behalf of the congregations:

The congregation extends a message of love to the family; wanting you to know that many of them remember Ailsa and her involvement with a number of congregations before and after the congregations joined together.

I have heard quick stories over morning tea on Sunday, and memories shared over a cuppa after meetings. (I mentioned a couple, and then concluded:) Many other stories were told - hopefully you will get to hear some stories today, over a cuppa.

Thursday's news announced a young dog was found alive in the rubble of the earthquakes in Turkey. The news reader suggested it brought new hope to the people still desperately digging through fallen buildings. The people need hope. Let's pray extra hard for hope for the people who are still living in uncertainty and cannot go back to what life was like before the earthquakes.

Let's not forget our own community where there had also been a natural disaster, people who need to be able to hope, and people who cannot go back to what life was like before the floods.

Heartache happens in all sorts of situations. People need prayer. Let's open our hearts in loving prayer during the coming week.

The Uniting Church has joined a coalition of faith organisations calling on Federal parliamentarians to support the referendum on a First Nations Voice. Uniting Church President, Rev Sharon Hollis, a signatory, said, 'We support the Yes vote as a pivotal step toward the full implementation of the Uluru Statement, so that as a nation we can finally confront justice and promote healing for First Nations people in this land.' She and UAICC Interim National Chair Rev Mark Kickett encouraged Uniting Church members to be informed about the Uluru Statement and the things it asks of this nation and urged people to create spaces for respectful yarning on the impact a First Nations Voice will make.
